

Action Martial Arts Magazine International Hall of Fame Inducts Grandmaster Clifford C. Crandall, Jr. (VHS / DVD)



In 2001, Action Martial Arts Magazine founded its International Hall of Fame. Grandmaster Crandall was selected for induction into the inaugural hall of fame on January 20, 2001 in the category of “Outstanding Contributions to the Martial Arts by a Grand Master.” Masters and Grandmasters from 12 countries traveled to the Tropicana in Atlantic City, New Jersey for the ceremony. Part of the ceremony included a short video of each inductee which played for the 1,300 attendees. This video includes the footage played regarding Grandmaster Crandall which includes his Guinness Book World Record skydiving board break, power breaks, meditation demonstrations and more. It also includes an interview, and coverage of the induction ceremony. The cover depicts



Action Martial Arts Magazine brings the history of the martial arts to the present for all to see and at the same time takes steps to recognize the future of the martial arts with a building dedicated to martial arts pioneers and greats. With TV, radio, newspaper and most of the martial arts magazines covering the event, it became the first true international recognition in the field of martial arts worldwide. Noted celebrity inductees like Joe Piscapo, Cynthia Rothrock, Philip Morris and Dan Severn were inducted and spoke of the benefits, growth and importance of the martial arts today. Grand Masters and Masters from over 12 countries came to be recognized and support a professional field of study and practice that has become a cultural part of every country in the world.

The banquet was held at the Tropicana Casino & Resort Hotel in Atlantic City, NJ. Over 1,300 people were in attendance making this five-hour banquet a once in a lifetime event. The first 9 minutes of this tape is dedicated to the actions and recognition of one of those individuals by his many black belt instructors: The head of the American Martial Arts Institute and founder of the American Eagle Style, Grand Master Clifford C. Crandall Jr.

The Second 8 minutes of this tape was produced by Tonfa Master Enterprises and focuses on the event, stars and excitement of this historic evening.

Information about the man: He has produced eight instructional videotapes and authored three books in the field of martial arts. His tonfa book and tonfa instructional videotapes have made him known as the Tonfa Master throughout the world since 1984. As the host of the Martial Arts Today T.V. Show for 12 years, he has represented the spirit and good will of the martial arts and American Martial Arts Institute throughout the United States, South America, Canada, Mexico, Japan, China, Russia and Europe. As a retired Superintendent of Schools in the State of New York, with classroom teaching experience plus the unusual combination of once being a principal of an elementary school and a high school, Grand Master Crandall brings to the martial arts an educational professionalism seldom seen in a martial arts school. The style founded by him is the "American Eagle Style". He is also known for the "Crandall System" which is a non-violent self-defense program which is taught in many public schools.


