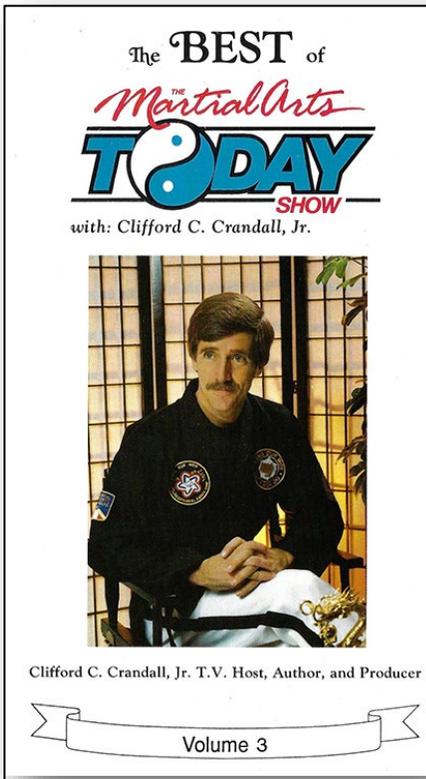

The Martial Arts Today show helped to spearhead the growth of the martial arts, not only in the subject area of martial arts styles, but in the areas of women's self-defense, child abduction prevention and, through personal interviews, provide true insight into the background of some of the actual pioneers of the martial arts as we

recognize it in the world today.

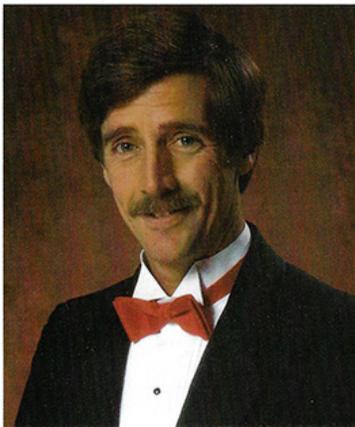
A series of seven VHS tapes were released with highlights of many historic interviews, including the demonstration of forms and techniques by world-recognized martial artists.

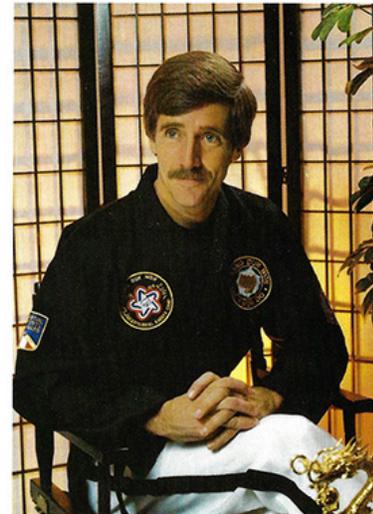
